Maryland Equips is a partnership between the Maryland Department of Aging and the Maryland Department of Disabilities providing free medical equipment and assistive technology to Marylanders with any disability, illness, or injury who need support to remain comfortable and connected.

Maryland Equips connects people with disabilities and medical conditions to free resources available through state agencies that can help them stay safe at home and connected to their communities.

Maryland residents of any age or disability can access available medical equipment, assistive technology, and other supports through Maryland Equips programs and services.

Maryland Equips is part of Longevity Ready Maryland, the state's multisector plan for aging to prepare Maryland for the growing number of



older adults through improved cross-sector coordination and service delivery methods. It provides value to the disability community by:

- Offering a single source for learning about available free and low-cost disability equipment, assistive technology, programs, and services.
- Providing state-supported credibility to available programs and services by separating them from for-profit service providers.

It provides value to state-led agencies and organizations by:

- Consolidating and standardizing outreach efforts among agencies to reach a wider audience.
- Reducing the need for crossreferrals to other programs for clients who need different, or additional products and services.
