Assisted Living Regulations and Affordable Assisted Living

- Task force has been asked to make recommendations.
 - O Tiffany Alston and Karin Lakin offered to take charge of leading a small group to discuss recommendations.
- Comprehensive and including small assisted living sector; looking at both the small and larger sector around affordability.
- Goal is to have equal quality across all sectors but there is a concern regarding affordability.
- Some small level of funding under the Medicare Waiver; majority of larger assisted living facilities do not participate in the Medicare Waiver which raises concern around compliance and stability.
- Need more information/data on the different assisted living facilities to better understand what is needed to help and create better environments.
- Discussed regulations regarding 45 day notice of moving residents from closing facilities and how this impacts older adults.
