**1. Welcome and Chair Remarks**

- Marian Grant introduced herself as Chair and shared her background as a palliative care nurse practitioner at the University of Maryland Medical Center and as a federal and state health policy consultant.
- Noted increasing state-level activity in palliative care and advanced care planning due to limited federal movement.
- Introduced new council members and acknowledged 11 current vacancies on the council.

**2. Introductions of New Members**

- **Lakshmi Vathathan, MD** – Section Chief of Palliative Care, Gilchrist Health System.
- **Katherine (Kat) Walker, PharmD** – MedStar Health; faculty at University of Maryland School of Pharmacy.

- Shared overview of MedStar's inpatient and outpatient palliative care programs, advanced care planning initiatives, payer partnerships, and CRISP integration.
- Highlighted challenges with advanced directive accessibility and opportunities for statewide collaboration.
- **Danielle Doberman** (newly appointed) was unable to attend.

### 3. Approval of Prior Meeting Minutes of October 20, 2025

- Motion to approve previous minutes was made and seconded.
- Minutes approved.

### 4. Update: Meetings with Maryland Department of Health

- Council leadership met with the Chief of Staff for the Secretary of Health in August.
- Discussion focused on the **AHEAD Model**, Maryland's new total cost-of-care model.
- State officials indicated continued interest in palliative care integration but requested follow-up later in the year as model requirements evolve.
- Secretary of Aging participated and expressed strong support for palliative care and community-based prevention efforts.
- Council formally acknowledged its placement under the Department of Aging.

### 5. Legislative Outlook for Upcoming General Assembly Session

- **Peggy Shimoda**, Hospice & Palliative Care Network of Maryland:
  - Pre-filed bills expected late December.
  - Anticipated reintroduction of physician-assisted suicide legislation.
  - Possible return of opioid-specific advance directive bill (HB 737).
  - Reported outcomes of a September workgroup reviewing the Maryland Health Care Decisions Act.
  - Key concerns raised:
    - Public confusion around ACP terminology
    - Lack of patient reminders to update documents
    - Surrogacy order compliance
    - Need for education funding and plain-language materials
- Delegate Martinez emphasized the importance of proactive engagement before session begins.

### 6. Advanced Care Planning & Technology Updates

- **Scott Brown (MyDirectives):**
  - Explained document uploads, notifications, and limitations when using CRISP without direct EHR integration.
  - Highlighted benefits of direct system integrations for patient reminders and document updates.
- **Brian Mangold (Maryland Cancer Collaborative):**
  - Identified over 378,000 ACP documents inaccessible during emergencies due to lack of CRISP connectivity.
  - Described a one-page educational brief to encourage health systems to enable HL7 feeds.

- **Sadie Peters (Maryland Department of Health ACP Effort):**
  - Shared outreach outcomes including State Fair engagement and community events.
  - Reported increased website traffic and ACP completion, particularly among younger adults.
  - Discussed targeted outreach plans, small grants, community health worker training, and digital advertising relaunch.
  - Shared availability of a statewide Advanced Directives Social Media Toolkit.

## 7. Upcoming Events

- Hospice & Palliative Care Network of Maryland Conference – **November 6**
  - Danielle Doberman presenting on communication strategies for advance directives.

## 8. Council Membership & Vacancies

- 11 open positions remain, including:
  - Long-term care clinicians
  - Legal community representatives
  - Advocacy organization representatives
- Members encouraged to recruit candidates and notify staff when applications are submitted due to processing delays.

## 9. Meeting Schedule Discussion

- Consensus that quarterly meetings are appropriate.
- Recommendation to increase meeting frequency during legislative session (January–March) as needed.

## 10. Council Annual Report Proposal

- Chair proposed a short public-facing council report for 2025.
- Purpose: summarize council priorities, legislative perspectives, and ACP issues.
- Council member volunteers invited to assist with drafting.

## 11. Additional Updates

- **Office of Health Care Quality** announced plans to translate the Maryland MOLST into Spanish, with future languages to follow.
- Feedback on translation requested prior to final printing.
